Dedication of the grave marker for Civil War veteran John D. Brown

On behalf of the Brown Family I would like to welcome you all here today. Seven generations ago, in about 1846, our family moved as pioneers into the land we are on today. But today we are marking the burial site of John D. Brown, U.S. Army veteran of the Civil War.

When I was a young man my mother and aunts brought me to this site many times. I always found it to be lovely, especially in spring. The hillside below us would be full of daffodils. Many of us have taken bits of these plants for our homes over the years. I would like to believe that our Scot, Irish and German ancestors brought bulbs over as treasured pieces of their homes in Europe. So to me this cemetery has always been the Daffodil Hill Cemetery.

John D. Brown was born in 1844 near Nashville, Tennessee, and died in 1901, along with his wife and two of his four daughters during the typhoid epidemic of that year. He was the son of Hugh and Matilda Brown. Hugh and his family, along with his mother and father, David and Elizabeth Brown, of North Carolina, moved to this site as early pioneers soon after the land was purchased from the Cherokee Indians by the U. S. Government.

Family stories tell of a Confederate raiding party that rode through the area confiscating food, and in particular new pairs of boots that John and his older brother Ben had. Shortly thereafter, John and Ben, after several years of indecision about the Civil War, together joined the Union Army for one year of service in a Kentucky regiment. We don't know much about the action that the brothers saw, but both lived to be discharged from active service near the end of the war.

Hugh Brown was an astute farmer and manager, buying and trading to add nearly 1000 acres of quality land near here. Much of his best land is today beneath the waters of Kentucky Lake. The Hugh Brown farm was located near this site, with smaller farms given to his 10 children scattered in adjacent plots around this area. Hugh Brown also donated parts of his land to build the old Johnson School House and the Bethlehem Disciples of Christ church, established in 1849 and one of the first churches in this area. Much of the original Hugh Brown farm was consumed under the waters of Kentucky Lake in 1946.

These are the 16 people we believe are buried here with John.

I would like to acknowledge my mother, Joyce Brown Byerly, and my aunt, Julia Brown Byerly, the grand-nieces of John Brown, for their life-long efforts to keep these family memoirs and history alive. They worked hard to make sure that John Brown and other members of this pioneer family would not be forgotten.

Mr. Gary Teckenbrock helped in many ways to complete the arrangements, bring the memorial stone out today, and arrange it at the grave site.

Mr. Johnny Nelson, current landowner, has always, and very generously, allowed our family access to this cemetery.

Sammy David Brown, 6 generations of Kentucky Browns later, continues to keep up the site of these graves. I hope future generations of the Brown Family will continue to visit this site, keep up the cemetery, and remember this family history.
